From this date, any messages from school will come via Arbor to the email address you've provided. Please ensure we have your most up-to-date email address.

#### **Download the Arbor Parent App**

Please download the **Arbor Parent App** to access important information such as your child's attendance and personal details we hold. From **September**, we will also use the app for **trip and activity payments**.

The app allows you to update us directly with any changes to:

- Medical conditions or allergies
- Contact details and home address

You should have received a welcome email from Arbor. To register:

- 1. Click the link in the email to set your password (use the "first time logging in" or "forgotten password" option).
- 2. Download the Arbor Parent App.
- 3. Log in using your email and new password.
- 4. Accept the terms and enter your child's date of birth.

If you need help setting up the app or have any questions, please contact the school office — we're happy to help.

## The importance of trips and visits.

There are many times when I feel proud of our pupils, but last week gave me a particular highlight. We took 71 of our Year 6 pupils to Willersley Castle in Derbyshire for our annual residential trip.

The whole experience was a resounding success. Our pupils were simply outstanding—not only in their behaviour but also in their enthusiasm and resilience as they tackled a wide range of adventurous activities, from climbing and canoeing to archery and team-building challenges. The week was packed with learning beyond the classroom: building confidence, strengthening friendships, and developing independence.

I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to all the parents for their financial commitment. I know times remain tough, and your support made this invaluable experience possible. My huge appreciation also goes to the dedicated school staff who gave up their time to accompany and support the children throughout the week. <image>



The trip, run in partnership with Manor Adventure, gave our pupils memories to last a lifetime—and skills that will help them grow far beyond the classroom.

Unfortunately, such opportunities are becoming increasingly rare. A 2023 Sutton Trust survey found that half of UK schools had reduced or cancelled trips and outings—double the figure from the previous year. English Heritage also reported a 28% decline in school visits to UK sites since before the pandemic, with rising costs making trips harder to sustain.

This trend is concerning, as the benefits of residential trips for primary-aged pupils are welldocumented. These experiences foster resilience, collaboration, independence, and selfesteem—particularly for children who may not otherwise access such opportunities. That was certainly our experience last week.

As these enriching visits become harder to fund and organise, it is more important than ever that we protect and prioritise them in schools like ours.
