What are rivers and how are they used? (Year 4 : Summer term)

Exploring the different ways water is stored and moves, developing an understanding of the water cycle. Naming and mapping major rivers both in the UK and globally. Learning about the features and courses of a river and how they are used by humans, and studying a local river to identify these features.

I hope you find these new pages useful, particularly if you are planning any educational outings over future weekends or holidays - (visits to museums, science centres, or historical sites for example). Linking any such trips to what we are teaching in school can really bring that learning to life for your child.

Morning arrival at school
