#### School Travel Plan

From as long ago as 2003, HCJS has been actively involved in promoting sustainable and safe travel to school. This work has been organised and led by the School Travel Plan 'team' although in recent years that 'team' has in reality just been the fantastic Angela Matthews. Angela is one of our school governors and has single-handedly kept the travel plan work alive at our school, although I know that in recent years she has successfully worked in partnership with Emma Lister at HCIS and Rebecca Richardson at HSM. Angela has been threatening to stand down for a little while now, but as her time as a school governor comes to an end, she feels now is the time to pass on the baton.

The aims of our School Travel Plan (STP) are to:

- 1. Significantly reduce the number of cars used on journeys to and from school.
- 2. Remove the barriers, both perceived and actual, to walking, cycling and using public transport for school journeys
- 3. Increase the number of young people and adults choosing 'active travel' options over that of the car
- 4. Increase understanding in our school community of the travel options that are available
- 5. Provide information for all involved with HCJS to understand the benefits of active, sustainable transport
- 6. To provide fun activities for the children to encourage sustainable travel to school.

I have been in discussions with the Parent Council. and I am hoping that some of its members may be able to take a role with the STP, but we really do need someone to take a leadership role. If you have a keen interest in walking or cycling, or simply have a few hours a month that you feel you could give to help us, please get in touch and we can have a no obligation chat.



#### Year 3 Fossil Day

"This morning we were visited by a palaeontologist called Jules Howard. We saw a fossil of animal poo and lots of other fossils like star fish footprints, ammonites, a whales ear bone, a crocodile spine and shark teeth. We saw the oldest fossil in the world which is a slime fossil.

Next we looked at bones. We saw a bear skull and the skeleton of a bat, rat and rabbit.

#### Hot meals

We just wanted to remind you of the procedure for ordering hot meals. Hot meals can be ordered each half term and are provided by an outside caterer. - Search an Ofsted-registered online directory for childminders, nurseries, holiday, breakfast and after-school clubs. Find your nearest Children's Centre and search for sessions and activities.
- View accessible SEND information including education, school policies, health, social care, activities, preparing for adulthood and support services. This information is co-produced with parents, carers, young people and professionals.
- Discover things to do in Bucks, from family days out, sports, clubs and groups to school holiday activities. Search by age group, activity type, SEND inclusivity, location, town and free/low cost


